## Westcountry CSI is...

an **opportunity** for people to connect to and protect their local rivers and waterways across the region.

Our Westcountry CSI volunteers survey hundreds of freshwater locations in Cornwall, Devon, Somerset and West Dorset to monitor their **health**. biodiversity and water quality.

By sharing our knowledge with communities in the Westcountry, we are creating credible and competent custodians of the rivers.

Regular water quality sampling produces robust data, which we can use to identify areas of concern while enabling citizen scientists to get to know their river, helping to spot positive and negative changes and influence action when needed.

#### What we do

### **River Monitoring**

Volunteers take environmental observations and water quality tests from sample points across the Westcountry.

#### Flora & Fauna Watch

Surveys include observations of the wildlife and problem plants seen along watercourses, helping to build a picture of our river ecosystems in the region.

#### **Data Analysis**

Each year, evidence collected is analysed to create river health scorecards for waterbodies with 12 samples or more.

### **Education & Training**

We create interactive opportunities for all ages to learn new skills and more
