MAKE A BOOKING

To make a booking, please complete the booking form and send to learning@wrt.org.uk

Once received, a member of the WRT Engagement and Learning team will be in touch to secure a date for your session(s), and a confirmation email will be sent to you.

If you have selected a riverside session and do not have a suitable local site, we can look for suitable sites for you.

PAYMENTS AND CANCELLATIONS

An invoice will be sent to the supplied email address following the session delivery.

Cancellations should be made no less than one week before the booked session date. If the session is cancelled less than one week before the session, the full charge will still apply.

Sessions can still go ahead in light rain and cold conditions, but all attendees will be expected to dress appropriately for the conditions (please see guidance below). If the weather forecast does not show safe weather conditions for the booked session date, the session will be cancelled at least one day prior to the session date. In this case, the session can be re-booked or cancelled without penalty.

RIVERSIDE SESSIONS

Where possible, we encourage riverside sessions to be held as close to the school as possible, preferably within walking distance. If transport is needed to the site, this is the responsibility of the school.





RATIOS

WRT Engagement and Learning staff will be leading the session. However WRT staff are not able to be responsible for the supervision of children and should be supernumerary in all staff: children ratios.

WRT recommend at least 1:6 (4-8 year-olds), 1:8 (9-12 year-olds) and 1:10 (13 - 18 year-olds) adult to child ratios for any riverside sessions.

PHOTO PERMISSIONS

WRT would like to take photos of some sessions for educational and promotional purposes. These can include our website, social media, press releases and our WRT monthly newsletter. WRT staff will provide a photo permission form on the day should this be appropriate.

WHAT TO WEAR ON THE DAY

Please ensure that both adults and children are dressed appropriately for outdoor sessions, and for the weather.

Wellies (or sturdy footwear that can get wet) should be worn for all outdoor and riverside sessions. Flip flops and sliders etc. are NOT suitable.

We also recommend wearing **long sleeved t-shirts** and **trousers** to minimise the risk of stings and scratches.

In warm weather, please bring a hat and sunscreen.





In cold weather, please bring a waterproof coat, waterproof trousers, a warm hat, gloves and extra layers.





HEALTH AND SAFETY

All WRT engagement and learning sessions are fully risk assessed, a copy of which will be forwarded to the school for review prior to the session. Please note, these risk assessments are not designed to replace the school's own risk assessments for children learning outside of the classroom. Schools/education groups should provide antibacterial wipes/gel for use while out on site.

If the weather forecast does not show safe weather conditions for the booked session date, the session will be cancelled. Please refer to the bookings and cancellation section for more details.


SAFEGUARDING
